Why did you decide to do a traineeship at Oiltanking?

I was interested in working in a business-to-business environment and Oiltanking seemed to embody and stand for many things that intrigued me at the time. The storage business is integrated in highly competitive industrial markets playing a crucial role in the chain of logistics that major oil and chemical companies rely on to be successful in their own business.

Logistics is a people's business; "making things happen" is very satisfying, especially if you can accomplish it through a combination of teamwork and a great company culture. By definition, the business is geared towards international markets and, at that point in time, the company was expanding, opening new locations all over the world. This has pressed on over the years and is set to continue. It feels good to contribute to and be part of a winning team.

Finally, I was impressed by all the huge ships and tanks I first saw in the brochures, and then in real life at the terminal, where I started out. It was simply overwhelming.

What was the most valuable experience you gained during your traineeship? What impressed you most?

I signed up as an "international management trainee" and I remember I had stated in my application letter that I wanted to gain an insight into all features of management from the technical aspects, operations, and logistics to the commercial and financial side of things, and ultimately general management. I was also involved in helping the commissioning of a new storage and truck loading system.

The key is to develop an affinity to the business, get your head around what it is that makes things happen everyday, who does what, etc. You tend to get a little confused at first, alternating between so many contrasting roles in a very short space of time, often in different departments and locations. However, very soon it all starts to make sense. Oiltanking is a flat organization and if you show application and an eagerness to work and learn, before long you are part of the team.

What advice would you give to a new trainee looking to embark on a career with Oiltanking?

It is very important to allow yourself sufficient time to master the basics at the beginning. Work in the field, get to know the operators, inspectors, truck drivers and learn from them; find out what they do and what makes them tick. In doing so, you will become proficient in the ins and outs of how our business works. Once you leave that stage in your training behind, you will not have another opening to acquire the foundations.

One of the things I like best about Oiltanking is that you cannot hide. Do the utmost you can, take it one step at a time and in the process make sure you have fun is the ultimate way to advance a successful career in the company.

Why did you decide to do a traineeship at Oiltanking?

I was starting my 3rd year at university and thought that doing something completely unrelated to my degree might be interesting. Oiltanking presented itself as an opportunity to spend some time overseas and at the same time get a little taste of the oil trade, and interact with a completely unknown environment in an unfamiliar location.

What was the most valuable experience you gained during your traineeship? What impressed you most?

Diligence is key, confidence in your team and yourself is essential, getting your hands dirty and working the field will enable you to appreciate the workings of the real tank terminal business. No university in the world can give you this. The thing that impressed me the most was that everyone at Oiltanking was keen to help, teach and even go out of their way to lend you a helping hand – this willingness to give assistance was evident across the board – from the technical staff to the management – and I believe it is still the case.

What advice would you give to a new trainee looking to embark on a career with Oiltanking?

Everybody is a potential source of knowledge and tool to help you along the way, regardless of whether you are an economist, an engineer or just someone who wants to work the field. Be sure to speak your mind and ask if something is unclear or should you think there might be more to it than meets the eye – you will either get answers or more questions to figure out for yourself. As we say in Latin America, you do not have to invent boiling water, but never be afraid to query old habits or traditions.

Why did you decide to do a traineeship at Oiltanking?

Working outside during the nightshifts, discharging railcars and loading ships in temperatures of -15 to -20 degrees Celsius, really gives you an idea of just how tough the business can sometimes be in practice. Coming from university, this was a great opportunity to be exposed to this intensive business at first hand. The most impressive thing here was that even though Mother Nature put up a bit of a challenge, the team spirit among us just kept on getting stronger. The zeal of our team was just extraordinary!

What advice would you give to a new trainee looking to embark on a career with Oiltanking?

When you start out at Oiltanking, keep an open mind; ask questions and be ready to be a team player. You will find being part of a team spirit that is unlike anything you might have come into contact with before immensely rewarding.

Why did you decide to do a traineeship at Oiltanking?

After commencing a career as a private banker, I realized that I wanted something more tangible and adventurous. At Oiltanking I found both. Tangible because of the multiple tank terminal facilities Oiltanking runs and operates. These terminals are constantly developing and you can literally present them to business partners. Adventurous seeing that Oiltanking is a truly international company. I discovered this quite early on, since I was posted to Finland, Estonia and Germany in only my first year at Oiltanking. Last but not least I wanted to work for a medium-sized company with uncomplicated hierarchical structures. In view of the fact that Oiltanking is a privately held company, its straightforward culture and short communication lines are evident on a daily basis.

What was the most valuable experience you gained during your traineeship? What impressed you most?

The dynamic environment: as part of a logistic supply chain, each of Oiltanking's storage facilities is involved locally with global oil and chemical developments. Much of the world news can affect this growth in some way, and therefore our business. The fact that we are part of a "bigger picture" impressed me considerably. Another type of dynamics can be found on a company level. As many as 42 different nationalities are employed at Oiltanking, making it an extremely international and exciting environment to work in.

What advice would you give to a new trainee looking to embark on a career with Oiltanking?

If you are open to new and international experiences and have a hands-on approach, Oiltanking can be the company for you.
